US Hosts UN World Habitat Day Next Week in DC

Each year, the United Nations (UN) designates the first Monday in October as World Habitat Day in order to bring attention to the state of housing across the globe. The twenty-third annual World Habitat Day will be held in Washington, DC next Tuesday, October 5. The theme, "Planning Our Urban Future," is designed to raise awareness for improved urban planning. The October 5 celebration will be co-hosted by HUD Secretary Shaun Donovan and Dr. Anna Tibaijuka, the Executive Director of the UN Programme for Human Settlements (UN-HABITAT). In addition to the official events in Washington, DC, there will be regional events across the country and celebrations in more than 50 countries around the world.
